

## Regulations for the Implementation of Award for English as a Medium of Instruction in the College of Life Sciences of National Chung Hsing University

Passed at the College Executive Meeting (Bilingual Education Executive Committee) on Dec. 23rd, 2021.

1. The College of Life Sciences of National Chung Hsing University (hereinafter referred to as the College), to implement the bilingual learning program of the Ministry of Education, provides teaching resource assistance, rewards the teachers of the college for English as a Medium of Instruction, offers EMI English courses, and specifically sets the College of Life Sciences to reward teachers for the implementation of English as a Medium of Instruction regulations (hereinafter referred to as Regulations).
2. Subsidy: The units and teachers of the College.
3. English as a Medium of Instruction awards and textbook consumables subsidy standards and amounts of each semester will be rewarded based on actual contributions if there are co-teachers. The EMI course includes required and elective courses as well as internships:
  - (1) Doctoral program seminar: NT\$50,000 will be rewarded for teaching each unit of the school.
  - (2) Undergraduate compulsory courses of 3 credits (and above), and more than 50 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$25,000 and a subsidy of NT\$ 150,000 for teaching materials and consumables.
  - (3) Undergraduate elective courses of 2 credits, and more than 50 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$17,000 and NT\$120,000 for teaching materials and consumables.
  - (4) Undergraduate elective courses of 1 credit, and more than 50 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$10,000 and NT\$90,000 for teaching materials and consumables.
  - (5) Undergraduate elective courses of 3 credits (and above), and 20 to 49 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$20,000 and NT\$120,000 will be awarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (6) Undergraduate elective courses of 2 credits, and 20 to 49 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$13,500 and NT\$100,000 will be awarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (7) Undergraduate elective courses of 1 credit, and 20 to 49 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$7,000 and NT\$70,000 will be awarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (8) Undergraduate elective courses of 3 credits (and above), and less than 19 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$16,000 and NT\$90,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials.
  - (9) Undergraduate elective courses of 2 credits and less than 19 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$10,600 and NT\$80,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (10) Undergraduate elective courses of 1 credit and less than 19 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$5,200 and NT\$50,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (11) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 3 credits (and above) and more than 15 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$25,000 and NT\$120,000 for teaching materials and consumables.
  - (12) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 2

credits and more than 15 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$17,000 and NT\$100,000 for teaching materials and materials.

- (13) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 1 credit and more than 15 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$9,000 and NT\$70,000 for teaching materials and materials.
  - (14) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 3 credits (and above) and less than 14 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$20,000 and NT\$90,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (15) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 2 credits and less than 14 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$13,500 and NT\$ 80,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (16) Graduate elective courses (open to undergraduates and graduate students) of 1 credit and less than 14 students enrolled: Each course will be awarded NT\$7,000 and NT\$ 50,000 will be rewarded according to the proportion of enrolled students for teaching materials and materials.
  - (17) Online core courses, 2 credits, for electives both inside and outside the school. All related research, works, teaching materials, and teaching aids generated by teaching activities belong to the college: NT\$180,000 will be awarded for teaching each course.
4. Application: After the enrolled number of courses and electives are announced in the course inquiry system of the school each semester, fill in the application form during the acceptance period of the school, one application form per one class number, and submit it to the relevant meeting for review according to the procedures.
  5. Teachers who are awarded the English as a Medium of Instruction must submit relevant teaching results at the end of the semester.
  6. The funds required for this Regulations are covered by the "Ministry of Education Bilingual Learning Program Budget", and the total amount of incentives for each semester can be adjusted flexibly according to the actual subsidy funds granted by the Ministry of Education for the year.
  7. The English as a Medium of Instruction awarded in this Regulations should meet the definition of EMI by the Ministry of Education, including the syllabus, content delivery, teacher-student interaction, learning and academic support textbooks, display and evaluation of learning outcome (such as oral statements, assignments, and test), the whole process should be done in English.
  8. This Regulation will be implemented after being approved by the College Executive Meeting, and the same applies for amending.
